Where are we now?

Our second year funding has been agreed and received. Planning is underway for our first DLP Collaboration Day (see over) and Provision Map are currently building our collective contract to get this software into all schools that want it. Our EP / SaLT casework panels have continued this term but we are looking at how to make them more sustainable, moving forward. The match-funded bid-in process for additional support will continue to run this year too. See below for further information.

How do I access this support?

Funding for speech and language support: as we did last year, we have costed for schools to receive 6 hours of speech therapist support a term. You can claim the allocated funding (£1,440) to cover provision you have or you can opt for this support to be provided via DLP.

Funding for additional provider hours: this will be discussed at the next steering group to identify an equitable way forward. Details will be shared, via email, as soon as they are clarified.

EP and SaLT casework panel: this is bookable via a OneDrive link. This will be sent out shortly with new dates (and possibly a new format)

Match-funded, **bid-in system:** this involves an application process where schools submit a form to be scrutinised by a panel. The paperwork for this can be found in the DLP Virtual Staffroom Team. **Training:** training opportunities are shared by email.

Provision Map: schools have already been contacted about this.

Virtual platform: this is a key part of the project, with lots of documents and resources shared on there. Please make an effort to log-on and see what's available.
