## Speech and Language Therapy Offer to Schools Academic Year 2025 - 2026

The school age Speech and Language Therapy service is delivered within a Balanced System® framework. Link Speech and Language Therapists (SaLT) are allocated to work with schools for a set number of days across an academic year.

Link SaLTs work with families and schools to develop and deliver provision for speech, language and communication (SLC) at a universal, targeted and specialist level across the five strands of the Balanced System® (families, environment, workforce identification, intervention).

Link SaLT time allocated to work with a school includes all face-to-face contacts and clinical admin time for things such as talking to parents, analysing assessments, and writing clinical casenotes and reports.

Schools with a Link SaLT allocated to work with them will receive the following offer:

- The Link SaLT will attend at least 1 multi-agency planning (MAP) meeting per academic year.
- The Link SaLT will meet with the SENCO to discuss the Working Together Agreement, complete Whole School Communication Plan and agree priorities for the academic year.
- The Link SaLT can support the school to develop universal provision for SLC, for example general advice to class teachers or parents/carers through conversations in school, training for school staff around identifying SLCN or creating a communication friendly environment.
- The Link SaLT can support the school to develop and deliver targeted
  provision for SLC, for example modelling groups, meeting with teachers or
  TAs to problem solve, spending time in class to give ideas around how a
  child's SLCN can be supported throughout their day.
- The Link SaLT can deliver **specialist provision** for SLC, for example assessing children, delivering therapy, and contributing to Education, Health and Care Needs Assessment Requests.
- SENCOs, school staff and parents/carers can contact the **SaLT advice line** to for advice on 0121 466 6231.

Schools without a Link SaLT to work with them at this time will receive the following offer:

 A SaLT will attend 1 multi-agency planning (MAP) meeting per academic year.

- SENCOs can request a 30 minute virtual advice meeting per term with a SaLT to support with developing universal and targeted provision and to discuss children on the Speech and Language Therapy waiting list.
- SENCOs can e-mail the locality School Age Coordinator (SACO) with general queries.
- SENCOs, school staff and parents/carers can contact the **Speech and Language Therapy advice line** for advice on 0121 466 6231.
- Children can be referred to Speech and Language Therapy by school completing the Mainstream Schools Consent Form and e-mailing it to the locality school age coordinator. Children will be added to a waiting list to be seen for an assessment in clinic during the school holidays, whilst the school remains unallocated.
- Children will be seen for an assessment to contribute to Education, Health and Care Needs Assessment Requests.
